### **Post Office**

The best time to visit the Main Street Post Office is typically before 1:00 p.m., though the post office will remain open for access to post office boxes and will hold normal hours as posted throughout the festival. Limited 30-minute parking spaces are available along 5th Street, behind the post office on Swede Alley, and in front of the post office on Main Street. If you work, live, or are staying near Main Street in the Old Town area, we encourage you to walk to the Main Street Post Office. There are two additional post office locations in Park City, in Kimball Junction and on Park Avenue next to the police station.

### Restaurants

Restaurants are busy and may be rented out for private functions during the Festival. If you plan to eat out during the Festival, the best option is to call ahead for a reservation or visit <u>www.parkcityrestaurants.com</u> for local restaurant information.

### **Businesses, Employees, & Volunteers**

Many employees at local shops and restaurants live in the Park City area yearround. Additionally, there are more than 2,200 Festival volunteers that make the event possible. Whether you are going to a screening, shopping, or eating, locals are a great source of information for visitors. # **PARKING CLOSURES & TRANSPORTATION**

### Ride on Park City – Let's do our part!

Before thinking about where to park, consider taking the bus, walking, or carpooling. The easiest, most efficient, and inexpensive way to get around town during the Festival is Park City's free transit system. Walking is another great option. Pedestrians are encouraged to use sidewalks, walking paths, crosswalks, obey traffic signs, and follow pedestrian controls. Download the MyStop mobile app to get real-time transit information.

### **Parking Closures**

During the following dates, parking will be closed at the following locations: January 18-February 4: Bob Wells Plaza Parking Lot January 22-February 2: Brew Pub Parking Lot (for City operations) January 22: Parking on West Side of Main Street January 23-February 2: Parking on Park Avenue (from Heber Avenue to 11th Street) January 24-February 2: Parking on all of Main Street January 24-February 2: Parking on all of Heber Avenue





### **Traffic & Parking**

Traffic congestion increases in the morning from 7:00-9:00 a.m. as students go to school and before the resorts open, as well as in the evening from roughly 4:00-6:30 p.m., after the resorts have closed and during evening commuting hours. Lowell Avenue, Empire Avenue, Lower Deer Valley Drive, Bonanza Drive, SR-224, and SR-248, specifically, experience increased traffic and congestion during these time periods.

### A few tips

• If possible, alter your schedule to avoid commuting during peak time periods

- Plan ahead and factor in additional time to get from place to place
- Ride the bus, walk, or carpool

• Winter weather conditions can intensify traffic congestion

### Drop & Load, Taxis, Ride-Share, Shuttles

As noted on previous page, parking will be removed from Main Street and Park Avenue and may be replaced with temporary drop and load areas. In order to pull over in these drop and load areas, the driver must remain in the vehicle and must be actively dropping off or loading in passengers. Please mind all posted signs.

### "Special Use of Public Parking" Permits

"Special Use of Public Parking" Permits are required if a business owner or company needs to load in/out of a Main Street venue, requires crowd control, park a satellite truck, store a POD, requires a lift/boom, or if an activity requires the use of public parking spaces. Call 435.615.5301 to obtain a "Special Use of Public Parking" Permit. Permit deadline is 72 hours in advance of any of the instances noted above. Please do not block traffic, be aware of pedestrians when you are dropping off or picking up guests, and be mindful of all posted signs and traffic or sight impediments when you are pulling over.





### PARKING INFORMATION

Public parking in the Old Town core area will be by permit or pay only January 24-February 2, 2019. Main Street patrons and employees are encouraged to ride the bus to avoid traffic and parking challenges. During the Festival, the last bus leaves the Main Street Transit Center at 2:30 a.m.

### FREE PARKING Richardson Flat Parking Lot

Richardson Flat Parking Lot is available, with free transit to and from the High School, from 7:00 a.m.-2:30 a.m. January 24-February 2. Take the bus from this lot to the High School, from which you can transfer to the Old Town Transit Center, event venues, and theatres throughout Park City. Parking in this lot is free throughout the festival.

### The Homestake Lot

The Homestake Lot is available to Main Street employees only, with proper vehicle registration for Parking Enforcement. This free parking lot is offered with free transit service extended from 8:00 a.m.-3:00 a.m., and an oncall guaranteed ride home after 3:00 a.m.

### **Resort Parking Lots**

Deer Valley Resort and Park City Mountain have partnered with the City to allow use of their parking lots outside of resort hours throughout the Festival. Resort parking lots are available for use parking 4:00 p.m.-2:00 a.m. daily January **24**-February 2. Free Park City transit connects both resorts to the Old Town Transit Center, from which you can catch a bus to other locations throughout town. If using resort parking lots, please mind all posted signs and regulations. Vehicles left in the resort lots after 2:00 a.m. will be towed at the owner's expense, as resorts perform winter maintenance during this time.

### **Ecker Hill Park-and-Ride**

Free parking is available at 2465 Kilby Road, Park City, UT. 84098. Park City's free transit system runs from the Park-and-Ride approximately every 10 minutes during peak hours.

### Sandridge Lots

Free parking access via Marsac Avenue. Note: these lots will fill early each morning.

### PAID PUBLIC PARKING OPTIONS

Paid parking is available in the China Bridge Parking Structure and Flagpole Parking Lot. During busy times, China Bridge parking structure fills quickly. Take advantage of parking lots outside of the Main Street/Old Town area before getting to town.

# China Bridge Parking Structure- access from Marsac Avenue

January 24-28: \$40 per day (cash preferred) January 29-February 2: \$5 per hour (max \$40) 11:00 a.m.-2:00 a.m. \*no in-and-out privileges.

### **Flagpole Parking Lot - Long Term Parking**

January 24-February 2: \$40 per day (cash preferred) \*no in-and-out privileges.

### **Private Paid Parking Options**

There are various private parking garages throughout Old Town. Private parking lots have their own payment structures and regulations— costs can vary between \$20 to \$100 per day.





### **Parking Permit Holders**

Main Street Employee & Business Parking Permit Holders: During the festival, patrons who possess the Blue Square Permit for Main Street Businesses may park in the North Marsac Lot and in the Gateway Center upper level lot, accessed from Heber Avenue. A permit guaranteeing a spot in the China Bridge garage is available for \$550 and is valid from January 24-February 2. This permit is available from www.parkcity.org/departments/ parking or by calling 435.615.5301.

### **ADA Parking**

Supplemental ADA spaces are available behind the Park City History Museum on Swede Alley below 5th Street. Additional ADA spaces are available in the Brew Pub Parking Lot on Swede Alley. All City parking lots that are open to the public will continue to offer ADA spaces as marked. ### **Residential Areas**

Park City welcomes guests to our community from around the world during the Sundance Film Festival. The increase in guests and visitors and the unique Sundance venues also bring increased traffic to our residential neighborhoods. Whether you are visiting, providing transportation services, heading to work, or picking up a friend, please be respectful when driving through residential areas. Mind the speed limit and posted signs and watch for pedestrians and animals.

Remember, help reduce Park City's carbon footprint. Ride like a local and bus it for free or walk, bike or carpool. If driving, please Turn your Key and Be Idle Free!

### Winter Streets Maintenance

Park City Streets Department completes winter maintenance for all public parking lots and streets between 2:00-6:00 a.m. daily. Overnight parking is not permitted. Cars left in public lots or on streets are subject to ticketing or towing at the owner's expense.
