



Transportation

- Implement Auxiliary or Supplemental Parking off site from the event. Must obtain permission if using private parking areas.
- Encourage participants to RIDE ON – utilizing bus, bike, walk, carpool before you promote parking options.
- Create a Bike Valet at your event. Great idea for summer events.
- Create specific areas for participants and spectators to either drop off or pick up family and friends.
- Create specific areas for shuttles, taxi, rideshare companies to pick up and drop off.
- Create incentives for staff, volunteers, participants and spectators to attend your event by bus, biking, walking or carpooling.

Residential

- Create a residential impact notice program. Encourage local residents to sign up the City's Text Alert System – PCEVENTS, and encourage event participants and vendors to also use this system.
- Create a residential traffic/parking mitigation plan to decrease parking and traffic in our residential neighborhoods.
- Encourage local residents to attend/participate in your event.

- Remind event attendees that they are in a residential area and they should be respectful of our community.
- Provide volunteer opportunities for locals to participate in your event.
- Provide benefits to other local non-profit organizations.
- Discourage vendors, private shuttles, taxi and rideshare companies from using local residential streets as a short cut during high traffic times.

Environmental Sustainability

- Remind guests to bring reusable bags and water bottles.
- Eliminate single use plastic bags and drink bottles. Use, sell or promote reusable bags and water bottles or use biodegradable materials.
- Use eco-friendly serving utensils (compostable, plant based, made from recycled material or reusable) and eliminate the use of single use plastic cups, utensils and pre-package or serving dishes.
- Use recyclable linens.
- Be Styrofoam free.
- Print any materials on 30% post-consumer recycled paper.
- Create reusable banners and eco-friendly promotional materials or up-cycle banners and promotional materials into new products.

- Distributed items must be made from recycled materials and be able to be reused, recycled or consumed.
- In coordination with Transportation mitigations, encourage the use of bicycles, busses, shuttles, carpools or other public transit to and from the event.
- Incorporate incentives for alternative fuel vehicles.
- Encourage enforcement of the no idling policy for staff and attendees.
- Encourage recycling at all areas of the event. Recycling containers must be partnered with trash cans.
- Waste water must be properly disposed of into the sanitary sewer system. It is prohibited to dispose of gray water into the storm sewer or directly into the ground.
- Compost food waste.
- Buy Local! – Food served or items sold are grown or produced within 100 miles of Park City. Offer and promote either locally grown or organic produce, food or beverages.
- Provide Vegetarian Meal Options.
