Round Valley Area

Quinns Trailhead

- **Description:** The go-to trailhead for the famous Round Valley Trail System. With plenty of parking, restrooms, and access to over 30km of groomed multi-use Nordic trails and 18 miles of groomed, multi-use singletrack, it's no surprise it's the place to be during the winter season. New this year are an additional 2km of Nordic trails and a 100% singletrack, multi-use loop. Find current conditions at <u>moutaintrails.org</u>.
- **Groomed Singletrack:** Rambler, Matt's Flat, PorcUclimb, Down Dog, Backslide, the Big Easy, and more
- **Groomed Nordic Trails:** Quinn's Loops, Matt's Flat, Silver Quinn, Barrel Roll, Land of Oz (no dogs), Two Pines, Round Valley Express, Hanscom's Hollow, and more

North Round Valley Trailhead

- **Description:** North Round Valley Trailhead is home to the "Crooked Mile," a 1.6 km (one mile) groomed Nordic loop. Due to a property ownership gap, this Nordic loop is isolated from the rest of the Round Valley Nordic system, making it a little less traveled. Other singletrack trails connect to the Round Valley Winter Trail system.

Old Ranch Road Trailhead

- **Description:** The Old Ranch Road Trailhead is a great place to find some peace and quiet and enjoy magnificent views of the Wasatch Mountains. With no maintained routes leading in or out of the trailhead you will likely only see foot/snowshoe traffic and you can quickly connect to groomed singletrack by following Happy Gillmor or Rambler Trails. The unmaintained sections of trails usually become packed in by foot traffic quickly after snowstorms.

Park City East

PC Hill Trailhead

- **Description:** PC Hill Trail is an excellent workout on foot or snowshoes with rewarding views at the top. Feeling ambitious? Connect to Round Valley Trails for a more extended outing. The adjacent North 40 fields can make a great practice area for those learning to classic ski (no winter maintenance in this area, so you'll have to make your own classic tracks!)

Clark Ranch

- **Description:** Clark Ranch is a great place to explore! New for the 20-21 winter season Mountain Trails will be grooming a 2+ mile fat bike/snowshoe trail (check out their grooming updates for info). The area is great for people who don't mind making their own trails too! Classic skis or a set of snowshoes will open the doors for exploration on this ample open space of sagebrush, scrub oak, and rolling hills.

Prospector Park

- **Description:** Prospector Park sits on the Prospector neighborhood's outskirts and has easy access to both the Nordic Groomed Historic Rail Trail and Lost Prospector Area Trails (no winter maintenance). The Historic Rail Trail is a 27 mile, 10-foot wide asphalt and gravel path. When conditions permit, a Utah State Park sub-contractor grooms the entire stretch. The Lost Prospector trails lie on a mostly North-facing hillside and hold snow well throughout the winter.

Rail Central

- **Description:** The Historic Rail Trail is a 27 mile 10 foot wide asphalt and gravel path. When conditions permit, the State Park grooms the entire stretch. Additionally, The Lost Prospector trail system is accessible from this location. Though not maintained in the winter, the Lost Prospector trail provides great views of Old Town Park City and is often packed out by snoeshoers and hikers.

Ontario Mine Trailhead

- **Description:** Located at 7,840 Feet in elevation, the Ontario Mine Trailhead holds snow early and late in the winter season and offers easy access to Daly Canyon and unique views of historic mining buildings. There is no winter maintenance of these trails.

The Farm Trailhead

- **Description:** The Farm Trailhead is located just off of S.R. 224 across from the "White Barn." The convenient location and quiet, hiking-only trails (no winter maintenance) make this a fantastic place to visit in the winter. From the Farm Trailhead, trail-users can also access the groomed multi-use McLeod Creek Trail, groomed from Kimball Junction to the Snow Creek Commercial District.

The convenient location boasts quiet hiking-only trails (no winter maintenance) on seldom-trafficked Quarry Mountain. From the trailhead, one can also access the groomed multi-use McLeod Creek Trail, groomed from Kimball Junction to the Snow Creek Commercial District.

The Woods at Parley's Lane

- **Description:** The Woods hosts two groomed loops off the beaten path for skiing, snowshoeing, or walking. The area also has an off-leash dog area. The groomed track is narrow, so not ideal for skate skiing.

Bad Apple Trailhead

- **Description:** A central access point in the Glenwild/Jeremy Ranch area, Bad Apple will get users to Fink Again and other trails in the Bob's Basin area. Easily accessible from I-80 with readily available parking.

Spring Creek Trailhead

- **Description:** Popular access point for the Glenwild area trails and Swaner Preserve. Stealth, Blackhawk, and Glenwild can be linked up for an 8+ mile loop. Bathroom facilities are not winterized so are not open for winter use.

Glenwild Park

- **Description:** Small public parking area near the Glenwild Loop Trail accessible from Bitner Ranch Road.

Silver Creek Village

- **Description:** An easily accessible 2.5 loop near the intersection of I-80 and Hwy 40. This is the first year that Basin Recreation will be grooming the Silver Creek Trail so conditions may vary as it is worked into the schedule.

Trailside Park

- **Description:** A one mile loop of groomed singletrack with ample parking. Accessible from both upper and lower Trailside parking lots, this trail is excellent for laps on a fat bike. Dogs are allowed off-leash and there are many park amenities nearby. If staff time allows, some of the beginner downhill bike trails are groomed.

Willow Creek Park

- **Description:** A set of winter trails winding through Willow Creek Park and open space popular among all trail-users. Flat and accessible, there is plenty of available parking and nearby amenities. Connected to East 224 and Millenium in one direction and Mcleod Creek in the other for miles of groomed trail possibilities.

Matt Knoop Park

- **Description:** One mile of groomed trail connected to Mcleod Creek Trail and the Willow Creek trails. Lots of parking and easily accessible from SR-224.

Wasatch County

Jordanelle State Park Ross Creek Trailhead

- **Description:** Ross Creek Trailhead is the Lakeside parking lot off SR-248 before Hideout. A State Park Pass or \$10 (\$5 seniors) day use fee is required. Relatively flat trails through sagebrush flats with terrific views of the lake and Deer Valley Resort.
- **Trails:** Wada Way backcountry trail (4 miles), Jordanelle perimeter trail connection and paved trail (1 mile).
- Groomed: No

Jordanelle Parkway

- **Description:** Running between Hwy 40 and SR-248 along the North side of Jordanelle Reservoir, this road with a separated bike path is slated to open in mid-December 2020. The public trailheads are not yet constructed. Great for views of the Jordanelle Reservoir and Mount Timpanogos.
- **Trail:** a 4-mile paved multi-use trail

Utah Valley University Trailhead

- **Description:** Upper east parking lot behind UVU campus just off Hwy 40, north of Heber. Easy to moderate singletrack through sage and oak with outstanding views of Heber Valley and Mount Timpanogos.
